



Public Interest Disclosure Act

Annual Report for Forestry Innovation Investment

There are two avenues for reporting wrongdoing under the Public Interest Disclosure Act (PIDA) – within an employee’s organization or externally to the B.C. Ombudsperson at the Office of the Ombudsperson. PIDA requires that FII, as a public body covered by the Act, report the number of disclosures that it has received. For the reporting period of April 1, 2023 to March 31, 2024, FII reports on the following as per Section 38 of PIDA:
